Concerns / Issues / Other (no sticker on map):

- Size of community is good
- Education system is good
- Jobs good
- Neighborhoods are pleasant
- Construction is part of life
- Growth - bad
- Mooresville is “manageable”
- School size is good
- Good Junior High
 - Note: 1/3 of students coming from New Subdivisions outside limits (Heartland Crossing, Waverly)
- Good place to work

- Town is difficult to patrol – too linear
- Neighborhoods - Old part is pleasant
- Neighborhoods - Sense of place and pride
- Truck Traffic from west (Henry county)
- Need Parking study downtown
- More land needed for industrial – northeast?
- Speeding is a problem
- Healthcare – they do have an immediate care center
- Sewer capacity / plant - need to increase capacity
- Public safety – large number of calls being made north of city and outside limits
- Need to convince people that “Mooresville is a good place to live”
 - Live where you work
- Parks and Recreation
 - Everything is on East side
 - We need a lazy river at the pool
 - Good programming
 - Pioneer park is an asset
- Downtown
 - Everything (businesses) are going to Plainfield, Danville, Avon
 - Businesses last about 6-9 months
 - Beautiful buildings
 - Downtown needs to be a destination – heart of the community
- Technology infrastructure is lacking
 - industrial parks are not wireless or high speed internet ready
